This year's audit shows a small overall increase in sow numbers – with 22 more sows with birth notified progeny and 30 without BN progeny. All lines are well represented with the smallest number to be found in the Stonebows with only 12 sows with BN progeny.

In the boars the numbers remain practically the same as last year with a further drop in the Lassetter line now down to 4. However an additional number of Berkshire boars were in the process of being exported to Japan around the time of the survey so it is encouraging to see this did not lead to an overall reduction in boar numbers.

As always it would be good to see a further increase in birth litter notifications particularly in the lines where less than half the sows are shown to have produced birth notified progeny ensuring the next generation and contributing directly to the conservation of the breed.
